## 1. Description

- 1.1. **Rally Colorado** will be held in Rangely, CO, July 20-21, 2018. The event is Round 5 of the Rally America National Championship. Rally Colorado also includes two Regional Rallies, the **Prospectors Run Rally** run on Friday, July 20<sup>th</sup> and the **Blazin Saddles Rally** run on Saturday, July 21<sup>st</sup>.
  - 1.1.1. The event starts at 8:00AM Wednesday, July 18, 2018, and ends after the Awards Party on Saturday, July 21, 2018. Between those times all competitors and crews are expected to follow all Rally America Rules for Safety, Competition and Conduct.
- 1.2. The event will be conducted according to the **Rally America Performance Rally Rules 2018 Edition** (PRR) plus bulletins, these Supplemental Regulations and any Rally Colorado Competitor Bulletins signed and posted.
- 1.3. The official Rally Headquarters will be at the Blue Mountain Inn and Suites, 37 Park Street, Rangely Co. 81648 (See APPENDIX 3 for maps.)
- 1.4. The **OFFICIAL NOTICE BOARD** will be located at Headquarters from the start of registration until the close of registration and at MTCs during the event. After the finish, the notice board will relocate to the awards party.
- 1.5. The rally will start and finish in Rangely, CO on both Friday and Saturday. Please see Appendix 3 for exact locations.
  - 1.5.1. Vehicles will be impounded at the Saturday Finish until released by the Rally America officials. Vehicles may be subject to a post-event technical inspection.
- 1.6. Location of Parc Expose'
  - 1.6.1. The Parc Expose' will be held on Thursday, July 19<sup>th</sup>, 7:00pm to 9:00pm in Rangely, Co at 402 W Main St, Rangely, CO 81648. Saturday Parc Expose will be held at the Service Park from 10:00am to 11:00am. Please refer to Appendix 1 for schedule and Appendix 3 for location.
  - 1.6.2. Competitors are required to attend all Parc's Expose in their driving suits. Competition vehicles, Drivers and Co-Drivers must arrive, check-in and park during the ½ hour preceding the start of either Parc Expose. Arrival times will be recorded and fines (\$100) and penalties will be assessed for failure to arrive on time or to appear. At the conclusion of the Thursday Parc Expose cars and competitors are released until the line-up for the Friday start..
- 1.7. Service Parks
  - 1.7.1. The Friday and Saturday service area is located on the property to the east of the Buck 'N' Bull RV Park located at 2811 E Main St, Rangely, CO 81648.
- 1.8. Road Surface
  - 1.8.1. Maps are included in the Route and Service Books. Road surfaces are generally smooth, gravel/clay/hard packed dirt in an extremely twisty configurations with elevation changes and exposures.
  - 1.8.2. Please Ref to Appendix 2 for Stage, Transit and Leg Mileages.

## 2. Organization

2.1. **Rally Colorado** is organized and conducted by Rally America Inc. Rally Colorado 2018

2.2. The primary point of contact for this event is the Chairman.

### 3. Entries

- 3.1. Early Entry opened on April 20th. The closing date and time for acceptance of entries will be on July 19th, 2018 at the closing of Registration.
- 3.2. Entry fee includes one Route Book, one set of Stage Notes, one Service Crew Kit, and entrance to the after event party for Driver, Co-Driver and 4 crew members. Wristbands or "Hard Cards" and tickets are required for entrance to the "food area". Additional tickets will be available at \$10 each. Additional copies of Stage Note books may be purchased for \$25 each.
- 3.3. A maximum of 60 cars will start the event. A waiting list will be used if needed (priority in receipt of full payment).
- 3.4. Event entries will be accepted electronically from the Rally America web site ([www.rally-america.com](http://www.rally-america.com)). Payment to be made on the Rally America Website on the Rally Colorado official event page [http://ra\\_2012.rally-america.com/events/2018/COLO](http://ra_2012.rally-america.com/events/2018/COLO).
- 3.5. The Entry Fee structure listed below is based on date of Payment Receipt in US Dollars. Amount does not include any charges that may be applied for credit card payment processing fees.
- 3.6. If your registration has not been completely paid for by the cutoff date for that level of payment, you will be moved to the next payment level.

- 3.7. All entry fee payments made at the event in Rangely, CO, must be made in cash. Any refunds due will be made after August 31, 2018.
- 3.8. The organizers reserve the right to cancel the event, at their sole discretion, if an insufficient number of paid entries have been received by the close of early entry. In the event of the cancellation of the event, all entries that have been paid, in full, will be refunded, in full.
- 3.9. Competitors who withdraw their entries will receive a partial refund:
  - Less a \$100 penalty prior to 06/01/2018.
  - Less a \$400 penalty from 06/02/2018 to the close of registration.
  - Entries withdrawn after the close of registration or are a no show are not entitled to a refund.

### 4. Insurance

- 4.1. Insurance for this event, against bodily injury and property damage, will be provided by a policy secured by Rally America.
- 4.2. Competitors, service crew members and all event participants including officials, marshals, staff, stewards and all other volunteers who have signed a Rally America waiver form and have been issued and are in possession of an event wristband confirming the signature of the waiver form will be covered by a secondary Rally America medical insurance policy.

- 4.3. Competitors must provide documentation showing Bodily Injury and Property Damage liability in amounts equal to or exceeding limits as stated in the 2018 Rally America PRR for both the rally car and any service vehicles.

## 5. Advertising, Identification Numbers and Tires

- 5.1. Rules for vehicle advertising, vehicle identification and tires are as prescribed in the **Rally America Performance Rally Rules 2018 Edition** plus bulletins and these Supplemental Regulations.

## 6. Fuel

- 6.1. Fuel must meet **Rally America Performance Rally Rules 2018 Edition** specifications.
- 6.2. Pump fuel will be available 24 hours per day in Rangely. Competitors may order fuel from VP Racing Fuel. The order form can be found on the Rally America Website. Competitors can pick up their fuel from the VP Racing Fuel Truck. Location will be announced in a bulletin.
- 6.3. Fueling must be performed on tarps in the Fuel Depots.
- 6.4. The Fuel Depots will be adjacent to the service area, after the competitor checks in to the regrouping control. Regrouping/transit time will allow for refueling time.
- 6.5. Fuel containers must be tagged with the Car Numbers allowed to use the container, and brought to the Fuel Depot Area. It is the responsibility of the Service Crews to retrieve their fuel containers.

## 7. Testing

- 7.1. The only practice or testing in conjunction with **Rally Colorado** will be at the official event Test Day on Wednesday, July 18, please see Appendix 1 for dates and times.
- 7.2. Any other practice or testing of any nature on any public road is forbidden:
- Within a 100 mile radius of Rangely, CO for a period of 120 days prior to and 30 days following 2018 **Rally Colorado**
  - All practice or testing within the above-noted boundaries and dates must be approved in writing by the Rallymaster and the Chairman, or their designate. Additionally, written permission from the property owner, or permits from the governing agency, must be obtained and presented to the Rallymaster and Chairman with the request to practice.
  - Teams found in violation will be barred from starting or excluded from finishing **Rally Colorado** and their entry fees will not be refunded. The Clerk of the Course shall be the sole arbiter of any potential violation. Participation in the event press / practice stage and/or event reconnaissance during their scheduled times is not considered a violation.
- 7.3. A number of test sessions on a closed road representative of typical Rally Colorado road surfaces, may be available to interested competitors on Wednesday, July 18, 2018. Test sessions cost \$200 payable when reserving. There will be two sessions 9am-11am and 1pm to 3pm. There will be a maximum of 10 cars per session. Test sessions will be assigned on a first paid, first served basis (entry must also be paid in full).

## **8. Reconnaissance**

- 8.1. One pass reconnaissance (recce) will be available on Thursday, July 19, per schedule in Appendix 1. This will take most of the day, and teams should plan on having their service crews take their cars through Scrutineering.
- 8.2. Competitors will be given simple instructions for a recce route, stage opening and closing times, and special speed limits. At stage starts there will be a recce control car to hold competitors until the stage opening time and then release them individually at approximately ½ minute intervals. Competitors drive their own pace through the stages and public road sections (but must adhere to the stated speed limits (30mph) and respect the opening and closing times).
- 8.3. A recce registration will be held on Wednesday, July 18 at the Blue Mountain Inn in Rangely. Please see Appendix 1 for times. All participating recce teams (driver or co-driver) must appear to collect their materials and register their recce vehicle. This will not be in lieu of event registration. The materials will include a vehicle identification sticker that must be affixed to the upper right corner of the recce vehicle windshield and plainly visible.
- 8.4. Vehicles used for reconnaissance must be normal street vehicles with no lettering or advertising which would call undue attention to the vehicle; exhausts must be quiet. No prepared rally cars will be allowed. The Clerk of the Course, or his designate, shall be the sole arbiter of the suitability of all reconnaissance vehicles.
- 8.5. Each participating vehicle must contain two or more persons, including the driver and co-driver of record for the entry. Additional passengers are allowed only if they are a registered driver or co-driver at this event using Stage Notes.
- 8.6. A radar gun may be used to check for speeding during reconnaissance on stages and connecting roads. These locations will be identified by a standard red RA "clock" sign. Penalties will be assessed as allowed by PRR 8.2.E.

## **9. Administrative Check**

- 9.1. All Competitor and Service Crew registration locations (See APPENDIX 3 for maps.)
- 9.2. Please see Appendix 1 for dates/times for all Competitor and Service Crew registration.
- 9.3. The following documents must be available for presentation at the time of registration:
  - Driver's license for driver valid through at least July 22, 2018.
  - Current Rally America National or Regional license, for driver and co-driver.
  - Proof of vehicle registration and insurance coverage at or above the Rally America required level of coverage for competition vehicle and all service vehicles that are valid through July 22, 2018.
  - Competitors must provide documentation showing Bodily Injury and Property Damage liability in amounts equal to or exceeding limits as stated in the 2018 Rally America PRR for both the rally car and any service vehicles.
- 9.4. All Competitors, Service Crew personnel and any other individuals associated with any team who expect access to selected event locations and/or will be servicing a competition car are required to sign a waiver and wear a wristband for the entire event. There is a \$10 fee for each crew member, unless they have a current annual hard card.

## **10. Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking**

- 10.1. Main scrutineering will be held at the Rangely Fire Department. Please see Appendix 1 for dates and times. Please see Appendix 3 for maps and directions.
- 10.2. At least one member of the team or crew must be registered before entering Scrutineering.
- 10.3. All competitors must present a Vehicle Log Book for the entered vehicle at Scrutineering.
- 10.4. Log Books will not be issued at the event. If you are in need of a Log Book, please contact tech@rally-america.com, before the event.
- 10.5. Each Competitor car must have applied the visual identification package as outlined by the 2018 Rally America Performance Rally Rules prior to exiting scrutineering.

## **11. Press Stage**

- 11.1. A Press Stage will be held Thursday, July 19, 2018. Please see Appendix 1 for dates and times and Appendix 3 for maps.
- 11.2. Rally America in Conjunction with Rally Colorado will make a \$10 per run donation to the local food shelf up to \$250.
- 11.3. Only competitors who have completed their registration, and passed Scrutineering will be allowed to participate at the Press Stage.
- 11.4. Anyone wanting access to the Press Stage must sign a waiver form that will be available at the Headquarters and may be available at the Press Stage location.
- 11.5. Directions and location to the Press Stage will be provided in the Competitor and Service Route Books.
- 11.6. Anyone riding in the Press Stage MUST wear a helmet, head and neck restraint device and driving suit that meets or exceeds the specifications in the Rally America Performance Rally Rules 2018 Edition, Sections 5.1 and 5.2. This rule applies to riders on all practice stages, VIP rides, Media rides, Spectator rides or any other ride that is on a controlled road.

## **12. Start of the Rally**

- 12.1. On Friday and Saturday the official Start Order, as determined by the Rally America Stewards, will be posted on the OFFICIAL NOTICE BOARD. See 1.4 for Notice Board locations.
- 12.2. The official start of this event will be in Rangely, CO in front of the Automotive Museum at 128 S. Stanolind Ave on the corner of Main Street. Please see Appendix 1 for times and Appendix 3 for location.

## **13. Running of the Rally**

- 13.1. All event officials will be identified by an event credential.
- 13.2. A team which does not finish a stage but finds they are able to continue will be allowed to re-start the rally at the next available service or MTC out control, subject to Steward and Scrutineering review and approval. The team will be scored as a DNF for that day's event.
- 13.3. Unposted speed limits for certain areas in Colorado are:
  - 13.3.1. Open mountain highways: 40 mph
  - 13.3.2. Rural highways 55 mph.
- 13.4. The route book will indicate competitor speed limits for all transits of the rally.



- 13.5. All rally officials and their delegates are Judges of Fact. Their observations constitute valid testimony, and they are authorized to report violations of these rules, and Rally America rules, to the Stewards.
- 13.6. **Drones are NOT allowed to fly at any portion of the event unless they have an FAA license, meet the Rally America insurance qualifications and have received permission to fly by Rally America.**

## 14. Service Parks

- 14.1. There will be one service used for both days of the event. Maps will be provided in the Competitor and Service Route Books. All Services will be Full Services.
- 14.1.1. All Service Areas will be by assignment. Assignments will be made by the Chief of Service Areas based on the size of the Service Vehicle. Total size of Service Vehicle and support rig must be made to the Rally Colorado Registrar, by the time of registration, for location placement. Each entry will be allocated a 20' x 40' service space.
- 14.1.2. If more room is needed, contact the Chief of Service Areas.
- 14.1.3. If you need to be located next to another competitor, contact the Chief of Service Areas.
- 14.2. The service area is at the empty lot next to the Buck "N" Bull RV Park, 2811 E. Main Street, Rangely CO 81648
- 14.2.1. Each team will be allowed room for One Service Vehicle per entrant. No trailers allowed in service unless used for servicing. Space is limited and teams with large trailers are asked to arrive early.
- 14.2.2. Trailer parking (drop) location is at the same location.
- 14.3. Servicing areas must be left as found. Spills must be cleaned up with oil dry and trash picked up.
- 14.4. Service Vehicles are not allowed on the roads to the Spectating Areas.
- 14.5. Infraction of event rules and/or Colorado law by Service Crews will cause assessment of penalties to their competing cars.

## 15. Awards Party

- 15.1. The Awards Party will be held Saturday July 21<sup>st</sup> at the Colorado North Western Community College, 500 Kennedy Dr, Rangely, CO 81648. Please see Appendix 1 for times.
- 15.2. Trophies will be awarded to the top three finishers in each class with 3 or more entries

## 16. Final Checks

- 16.1. Any inspections and/or teardowns of any competing vehicles following the competition will be at the sole discretion of the Chief Scrutineer and Rally America Stewards. Those selected will be given directions to the location.

## 17. Results

- 17.1. Informational scores may be posted on the Official Notice Board during the event.
- 17.2. Provisional results will be posted as soon as possible at the Awards Party. Scores shall be signed by a Rally America Steward and declared official 30 minutes after the Provisional scores are correctly posted, pending resolution of claims filed during the thirty-minute period.

## 18. Inquiries and Claims

- 18.1. Please review the **Rally America Performance Rally Rules 2018 Edition**, and Bulletins for Scoring Inquiries and Claims Procedures and Fees.
